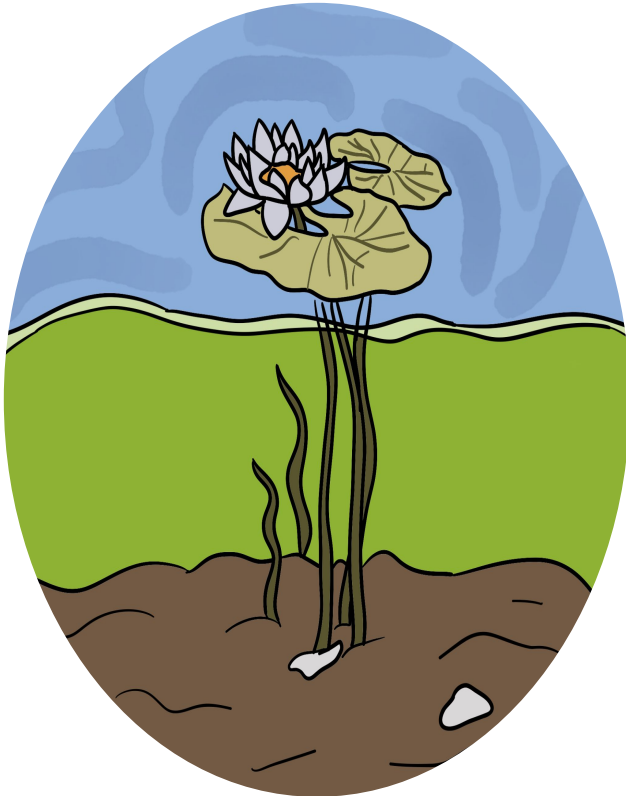


Wetland Plants

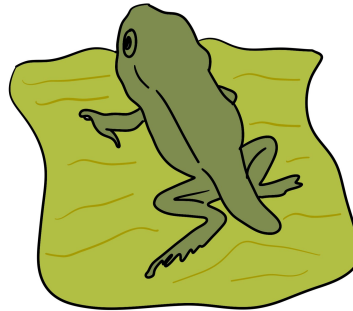
- Plants make their own food.

Ducks have waterproof feathers to stay dry in the water.

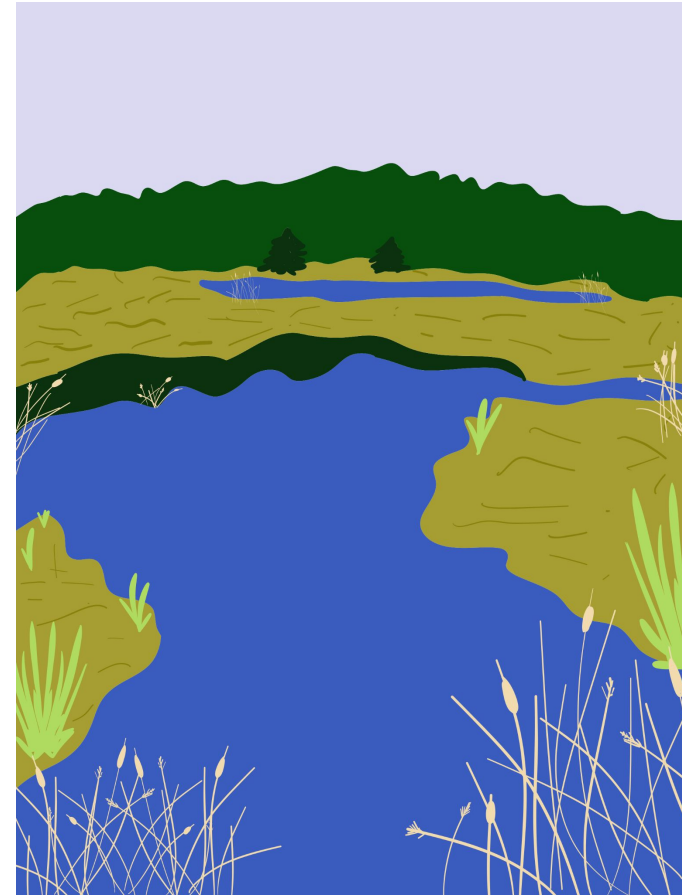


Tadpoles turn into frogs.

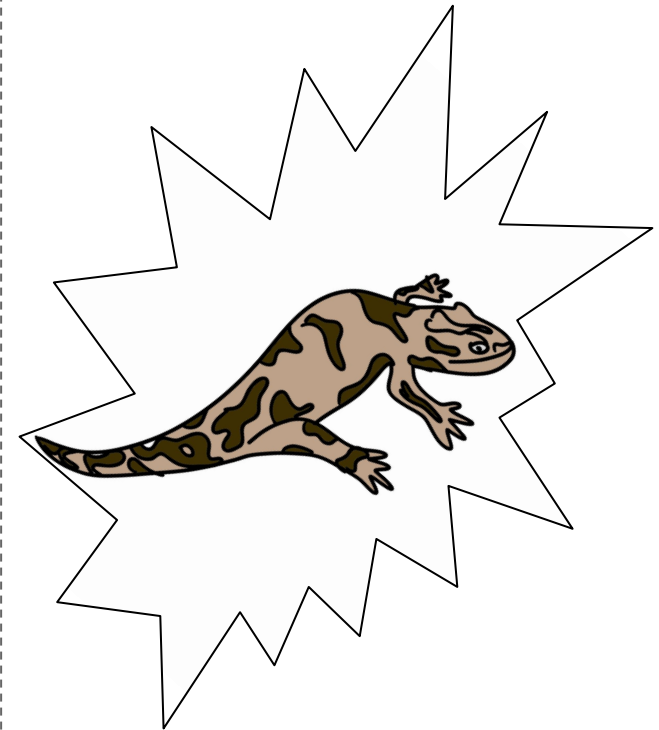
