The vacated convictions, based on confession and forensic evidence and supported by the district attorney, have not changed the minds of many of those who participated in the original prosecutions. Many within the NYPD and one of the ADAs who oversaw the prosecution say the teenagers are guilty. They agree that another man raped the Central Park Jogger, but they argue that his culpability does nothing to contradict the guilty verdicts of the five young men.
