Format	<p>If a quotation ends in a period, the period is removed from the quotation and placed after the citation:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• "But I have no humanity. I'm an alien. Like Superman. You didn't hear?' He makes a noise like a laugh, but it is devoid of joy" (Yoon 202). <p>If the quotation ends in an exclamation point or a question mark, this punctuation stays at the end of the quotation, and a period is added after the citation:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• "Why choose a seventeen-year-old girl? Why not choose a philosopher or	<p>If citing more than one line of poetry, the lines should be separated by a slash with a space on either side:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• "Are you - Nobody - too? / Then there's a pair of us!"
