

Non-Exemplar Argumentative Multi-Paragraph Outline

Prompt: Choose one of the symbols from *The House on Mango Street*. Write a four-paragraph analytical essay to explain what the symbol represents and how it helps develop the reader's understanding of the characters and or setting.

Claim: Names symbolize the discovery of identity in *The House on Mango Street*.

Reason 1:
Name symbolizes conflicted feelings about identity.

Topic Sentence: In the vignette "My Name," Esperanza's name symbolizes her conflicted feelings about her identity.

Supporting Details:

- Name means one thing in Spanish and a different thing in English → "In English, my name means hope. In Spanish, it means too many letters" (10).

- Esperanza wishes she had a name which showed her agency and independence → "I would like to baptize myself under a new name, a name more like the real me, the one nobody sees, Esperanza as Lisandra or Maritza or Zeze the X" (11).

Reason 2:

Trees symbolize hopes and aspirations for the future.

Topic Sentence:

Another symbol in the book is trees. Trees symbolize hopes and aspirations for the future.

Supporting Details:

- Trees can survive and thrive even in hard places.
- Trees need plants and nutrients to grow.
- Kids really have fun playing in trees.
