

PLACE VALUE WAR PROCEDURES

K-2nd Grade Mathematics

How to play:

1. Shuffle the cards and deal them equally to Players A and B.
2. Players A and B: Put cards in a pile, numeral side down (Tens Version) or face down (Tens and Ones Version). At the same time, flip over the top card.
3. Say the numbers out loud and figure out which number is greater.

If the cards are the same, each player puts down 1 more card.

4. Fill in the recording sheet. Note that your recording sheet will look different than your partner's because you are writing from your point of view. Example:

Player A	My number:	(circle one)	My partner's number:
	45	greater than/less than	65

Player B	My number:	(circle one)	My partner's number:
	65	greater than/less than	45

5. The player with the greater number takes all cards from that round and puts them in a "win" pile.
6. Keep playing until all cards are used.
7. Count your win piles. The player with more cards wins.
