Girls are more likely to be cyberbullied via social media than boys. There is a stronger association between social media and depression in girls compared with boys. • The authors call for more investigation into the role of social media in suicidality.
	How you might use the source in your speech
	My anecdote will be about how social media negatively impacted me when I was twelve years old. I might use this source following my anecdote to explain how researchers speculate that social media is a factor for the increase in suicide rate among girls my age. This will show that my story about social media's harm is one of many.
