Main idea 1 Pen America's warning about censorship and history	1-3 Supporting details: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Unprecedented; occurring at multiple government levels (local-federal) ● Rightwingers create fear about progressive books ● Book burnings in Nazi Germany
Main idea 2 Marginalized voices most frequently banned	1-3 Supporting details: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Censorship of race/gender/history topics ● Banned books: <i>Beloved</i> by Toni Morrison, <i>Normal People</i> by Sally Rooney, and <i>Slaughterhouse-Five</i> by Kurt Vonnegut
Main idea 3 Most banning in red states	1-3 Supporting details: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Florida - 4,561 instances across 33 districts ● Ron Desantis, directly involved - bans are a "hoax"
Main idea 4 (Optional) Public education and school libraries	1-3 Supporting details: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Classroom curriculum (determined by state guidelines and educations) vs. libraries (free ideas) ● <i>Pico vs. Island Trees</i> - violation of first amendment when school boards restrict books because they do not like them
